News Briefs

- **RENOVATION WORK CONTINUES.** We completed multiyear exterior-preservation work under a State Historical Fund grant that supported repairs to the theater facade, roof, chimney and wall, southeast corner foundation stabilization, storm windows and development of an ongoing maintenance plan. Not highly visible, but important to the long-term future of the building, we are beginning foundation repairs in the basement. We also replaced the well-worn stone threshold in the theater entry.
- **NEW GRANTS RECEIVED.** The Helmle-Shaw Foundation gave us, for the fourth straight year, a general-purpose grant in memory of Dr. Edward Carter. Enterprise Products of Houston and Texas Instruments each gave us a matching grants for member contributions. The Pioneer Jubilee Women's Club, continuing their many years of generous support, gave us grants for the movie program and our youth programs. The Lake City Lodging Tax Board awarded us a grant to support advertising for the Arts & Crafts Fairs. The Nichols Foundation awarded a grant for foundation repairs. The Lake Fork Community Foundation awarded a grant to purchase equipment for the theater. Colorado Council on the Arts gave us a grant to support our youth programs.
- **YOUTH PROGRAM.** 2010 Summer Arts for Youth Programs were a success. We received a \$6,500 grant from the Colorado Council on the Arts along with generous donations from the Lake City Pioneer Jubilee Women's Club and you, our supporters, allowed us to continue the programs for another summer, lower the tuition, offer scholarships and add additional theater and painting camps.
